First Day of Class: May 23, 2022 Last Day of Class: June 29, 2022

> The Course Meets: Monday - Thursday 9 AM – 1 PM

- Learn to use maps, locational reference systems, and GPS.
- Learn excavation techniques including laying out the grid, labeling units, describing deposits, using shovel and trowel, screening and sorting, and labeling finds and samples.
- Learn about recording standing structures, historical artifacts, bottles and bottle glass, and recording ceramics.
- Learn correct photographic techniques, about scales, North Arrows, and Information Boards, and photographing artifacts.
- Learn the basics of field illustration, drawing horizontal and vertical surfaces, and drawing artifacts.

Get sore, sunburned, bug-bitten, and dirty.

This course can prepare the participant for entry level positions in Cultural Resource Management (CRM) jobs.

Students are responsible for their own transportation to Holly Bend (carpooling is strongly encouraged).
